



**MSORV Fall Meeting
October 16, 2013**

The Fall 2013 MSORV Meeting was held at The Ohio State University, Center for Electron Microscopy and Analysis (CEMAS, on October 16, 2013 and hosted by MSORV Treasurer, Henk Colijn. There were 9 vendors (11 Sales Reps) representing our Corporate sponsors in addition to 43 members and guests present. The afternoon began with registration and a reception sponsored by FEI and MSORV. During the reception, attendees networked, visited with vendors, and toured the CEMAS facility. MSORV President, Dan Kremser, opened the meeting and Henk Colijn welcomed MSORV on behalf of CEMAS.

The talks began at 4:20PM with the first speaker being MSA Tour Speaker, Bob Price. Bob is a Professor at the University of South Carolina Medical School and the Director of the Imaging facility there. Bob is also the Editor in Chief of the number 1 microscopy journal in the world, Microscopy & Microanalysis. His talk was on “Confocal Microscopy: Technical Considerations and Applications in a Core Imaging Facility”.

After Bob Price’s talk, a short MSORV Business Meeting was held. It was noted that the Secretary’s Report from our last meeting, April 17, 2013 is available to read on the MSORV website: www.msorv.org. Henk Colijn gave a brief update on the Treasury. Between Savings and Checking, prior to the expenses from this meeting, we have ~\$13,700 in our accounts. Dan Kremser, our President, announced the results from the elections. 37% of the membership voted, and the results are: Dave Tomlin, as President-elect, Henk Colijn, as Treasurer, and Pam Lloyd, as Secretary. These positions begin on January 1, 2014, and at that time, Caroline Miller will become our new President.

Under new business, Dan introduced MSA President-elect, Jeanette Killius and invited her to say a few words. Jeanette talked about all the opportunities for students through Post-docs to get awards and financial support to attend the M&M 2014 meeting August 4-8, 2014 in Hartford, CT. She also talked about the various awards and encouraged everyone to get their nomination packets in by November 15th. Also, she mentioned that the paper submission deadline for this meeting has been moved up and will be February 8, 2014. The M&M 2014 meeting is a joint meeting with MAS, IMS, MSC, and IUMAS 6. Dan Kremser gave some information pertaining to the IUMAS 6 meeting which begins on Saturday, August 2nd. There

are a lot of interesting symposia and workshops being offered during those two days prior to M&M 2014 starting.

Jeanette also talked about the upcoming MSNO meeting (Microscopy Society of Northeast Ohio) on October 24th. It will be at Kent State and the keynote speaker is world renowned anthropologist, Dr. Owen Lovejoy. She invited everyone to attend and said information can be found on the MSNO website.

Dan Kremser mentioned that the MAS Topical Conference, EBSD 2014, will be the 2nd week of June for 3 days at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, PA.

The final discussion under new business was that we need a host for our Spring MSORV meeting and also our Fall MSORV meeting. The spring meeting should be in the Dayton area and the Fall meeting in the Cincinnati area.

With no further business to discuss, the Business Meeting was adjourned at 5:40 PM.

At this time, we continued with tours of the CEMAS facility, the mixer and also visiting with our Corporate Sponsors.

The meeting resumed at 6:10 PM and Dan Kremser introduced Beverly Giamarra, MSORV's first president. Beverly gave a brief introduction as to how MSORV came about. It was very informative and we were happy that she continues to join our meetings with us whenever she can. The final talk of the evening, was from the MAS Tour Speaker, Dr. David B. Williams. Dr. Williams is currently the Dean of The College of Engineering, at The Ohio State University, but he is a world-renowned microscopist and it was a pleasure to have him speak. His talk, "Reflections on Microscopy & Analysis: From Viewing the Small World to Leading on a Larger Stage". His talk was very enjoyable and very enlightening to both the young student microscopist to the many seasoned microscopists in the audience.

Closing remarks were given by Dan Kremser and the Fall meeting concluded at 7:40 PM.
